Registration @ 6pm on **Monday, 9/13**

Randomly ordered #'s will be given out **at 6 pm** & we will start registration as soon as all parents have drawn a number. We will take latecomers in the order in which they arrived after all of the registrants who drew #s at 6pm are finished...or you can leave your registration card with us with payment for processing after in-person registrants (with alternate course choices in case the course you want gets filled).

**KID'S CLUB will start on the 3rd day of school,
Tuesday, September 14th**

Since school starts late this year, Kid's Club is half-price for the month of September.

Please be prepared to pay in full at the time of registration. We cannot hold course spots without payment (and any past due \$ from June '10) and have 2nd&3rd choices ready as some courses fill up quickly.

If you are only registering for Kid's Club (no courses) **YOU DO NOT NEED TO COME TO REGISTRATION**--Please leave a "Fall '10' registration card and payment in the Kid's Club/Afterschool mailbox in the main office. You can leave your 3 choices for a free course--& wait for us to place your child in an open spot after we are done with in-person registration.

CHESS K-5th Novice/Inter/Adv Levels *Monday*

SPORTS VARIETY

THE SCIENTIFIC METHOD/EXPERIMENTS *Tuesday*
Join Mr. Ammary afterschool to investigate the 'scientific method'. Let's see if our experiments can fly, float, or explode! *Science teacher Abe Ammary is happy to be back for the Fall term making science come alive for our inquisitive students.* (\$15 materials fee will be charged)

GIRL POWER *Wednesday*
Empowering girls through sports and activity challenges, this class will be full of fast-paced, high-energy SPORTS and cooperative GAMES that involve communication, teamwork, and planning skills. Each class will be filled with fun and exciting new activities. Students will leave each class with a sense of accomplishment! *This course will be taught by veteran Physical education teacher Kathy Nobles.*

DOUBLE DUTCH JUMP ROPE *Thursday*
Did you know that double Dutch was brought to America by Dutch settlers when they settled in what is now New York City? Double Dutch includes at least three people—two rope turners and one jumper. Students will learn the basic objective of the game (jumping over two ropes which are turning in opposite directions at the same time) and we will all

have a blast! Fifth grade teacher Nancy Henry is looking forward to leading this NEW course in the fall.

BOY'S SPORTS AND ACTIVITY CHALLENGE Thursday

This new class will be full of fast-paced, high-energy SPORTS and cooperative GAMES that involve communication, teamwork, and planning skills. Each class will be filled with fun and exciting new activities. Students will leave each class with a sense of accomplishment! *This course will be taught by veteran Physical education teacher Kathy Nobles.*

ROBOFUN Wednesday \$360 Wednesday

This is exciting opportunity for students is back for another term! Students will design and program interactive robots with the LEGO® NXT® Mindstorms® Education kit. Students learn science through engineering and computer programming concepts to make their robots come alive. Students use a mini computer, called the LEGO® NXT®, plus servo motors, light sensors, ultrasonic sensors, sound sensors, and touch sensors to create intelligent robots that they program to respond to their environment. Some example robotic projects might include a locker alarm system, sensor-activated ball launcher, a wack-a-mole arcade game, or search and rescue bot. Students develop skills in creativity, cooperative learning, spatial reasoning, mechanics, computer programming, logic, critical thinking, and problem solving. Students do not take home their projects but families are invited to a presentation of final projects. *This course needs 10 students to run, and is capped at 12 students max.*

PLEASE REVIEW ALL INFORMATION (there are some changes)

KID'S CLUB - after school care (3-6 pm)--snack and free play time, then homework help. We have nine Kid's Club Staff members (and two PS 29 teachers who join the KC Staff for a half an hour Mondays-Thursdays for hw help). This allows us to more fully support homework help and to have a higher adult to student ratio!

Kid's Club Fees 2010-2011

WE ARE HAPPY TO REPORT THAT WE HAVE KEPT PRICES STEADY FOR KID'S CLUB FOR THE PAST 4 YEARS!

September is **HALF PRICE** due to school starting so late this year. Fees for the rest of the year are based on the 180-day calendar and pro-rated accordingly so that the monthly fee remains constant October through June regardless of school holidays. There is a 25% discount for siblings. (see registration card). If your child attends Kid's Club 5 days per week, you can choose one FREE course.

PETIT Plan 3-3:30 pm

The children have a snack and a short time to play outside. You can register for the Petit Plan for one to five days per month. Petit plan is NOT available on a daily basis.

M-F Petit is \$125 monthly \$25 per month for each registered weekly day--*Example: 2x per week would be \$50 monthly.*

Emergency Care is available on a daily basis for \$30 per day (\$45 for siblings). Care is available until 6pm and is NOT pro-rated if you pick up your child earlier than 6pm.
